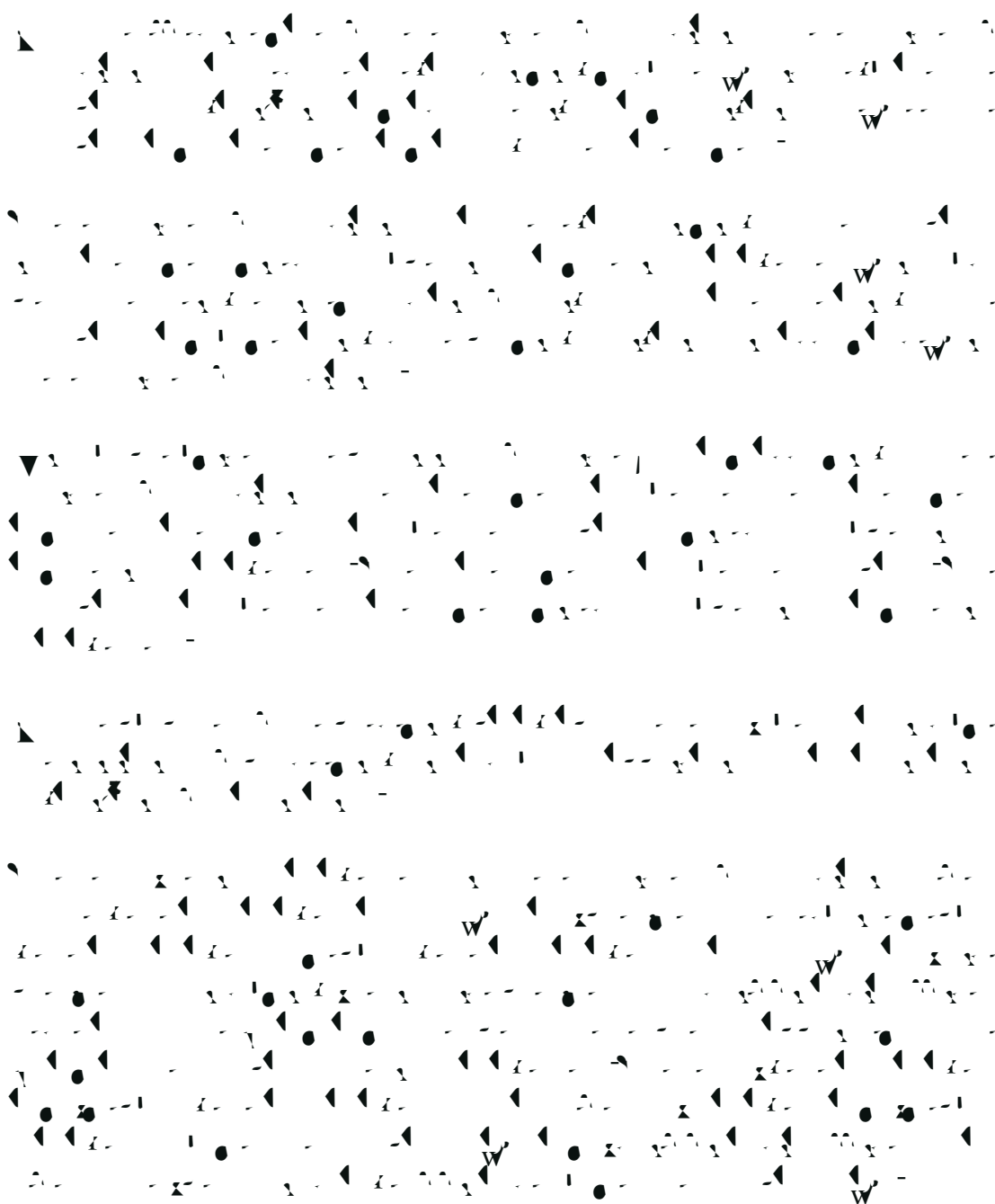

CHAPTER 2 OPERATIONAL OBJECTIVES AND SCOPE

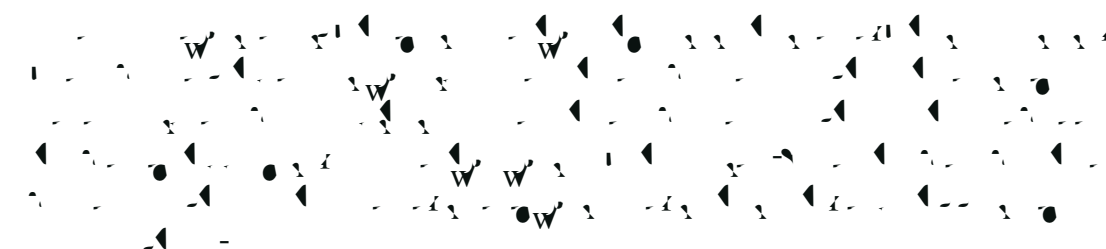

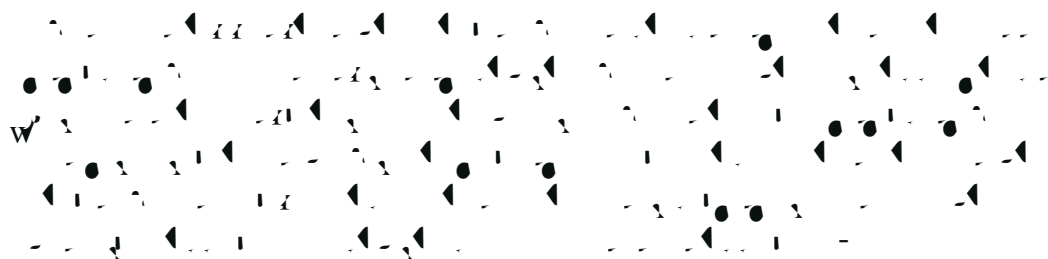
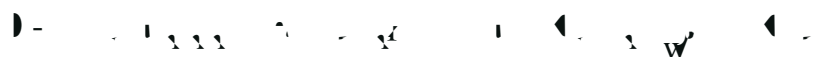

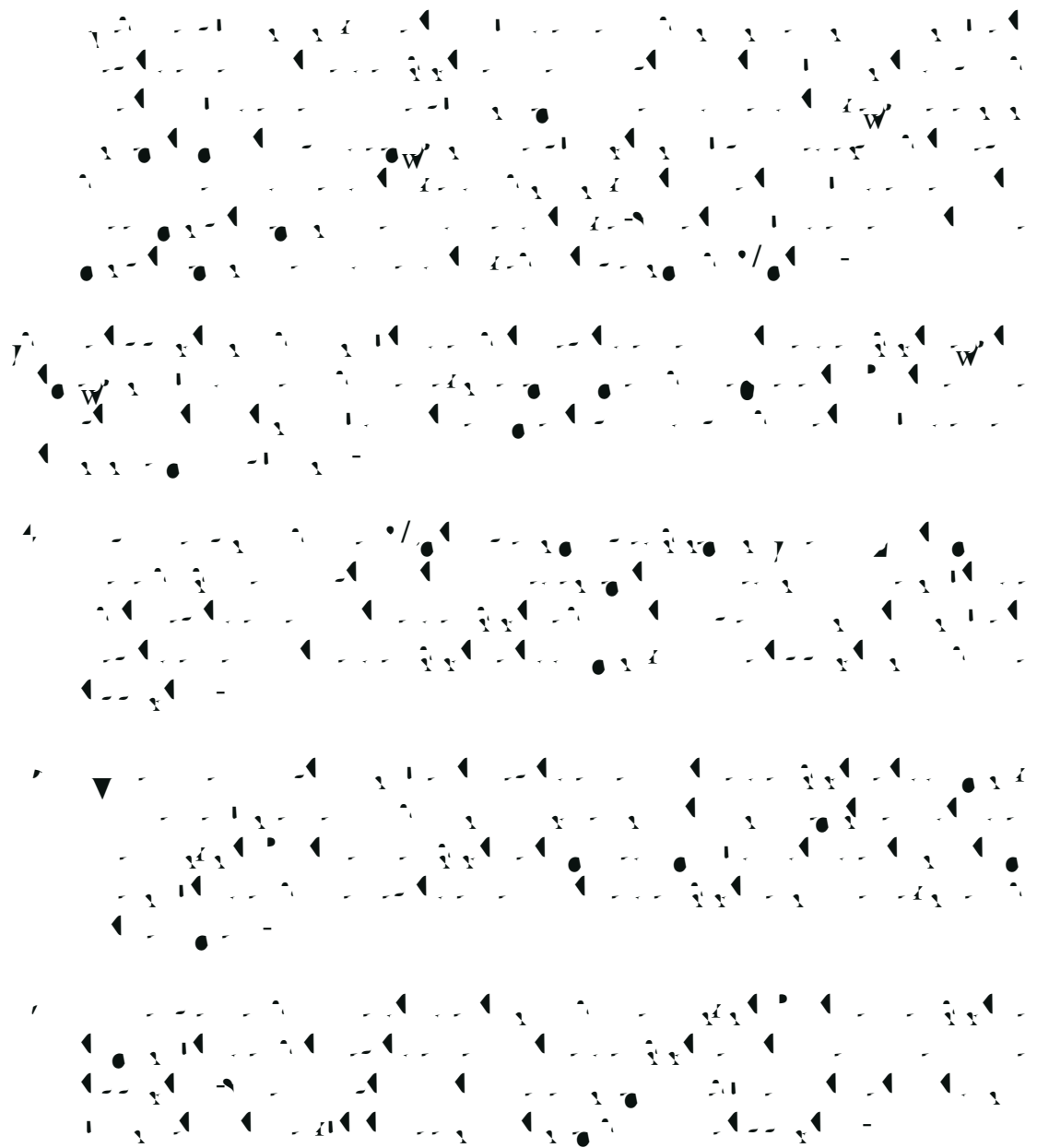

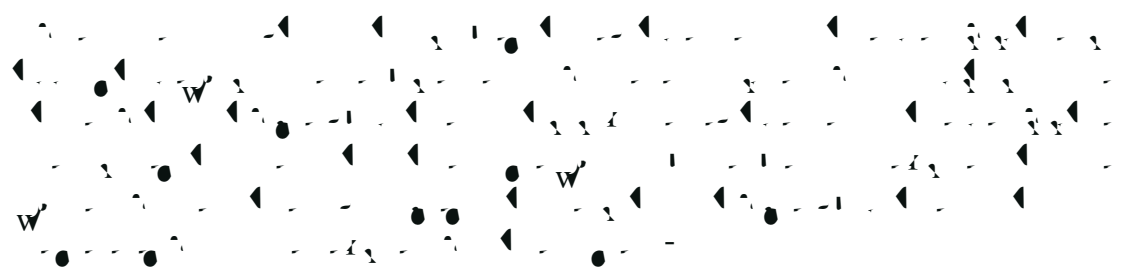

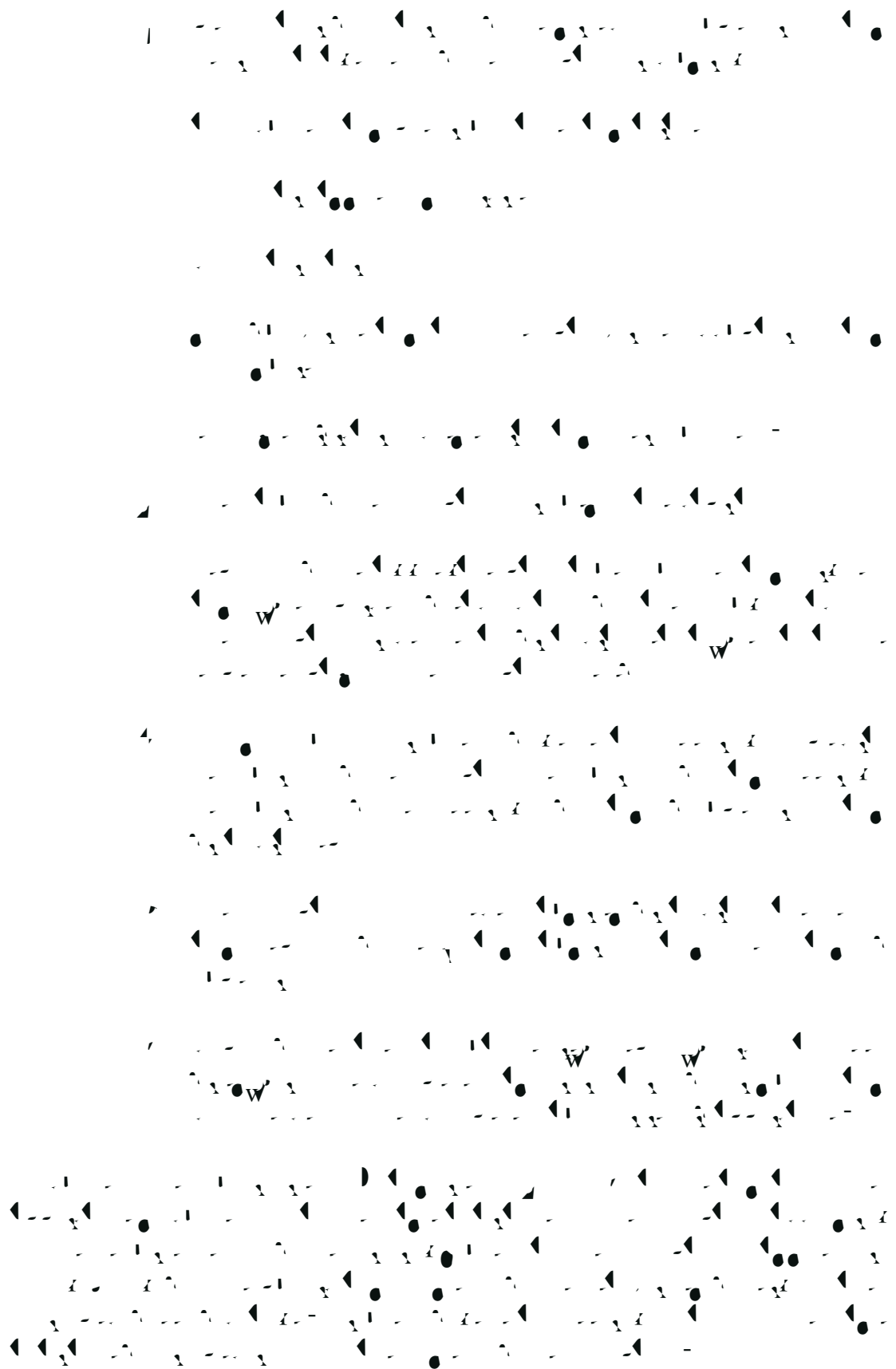

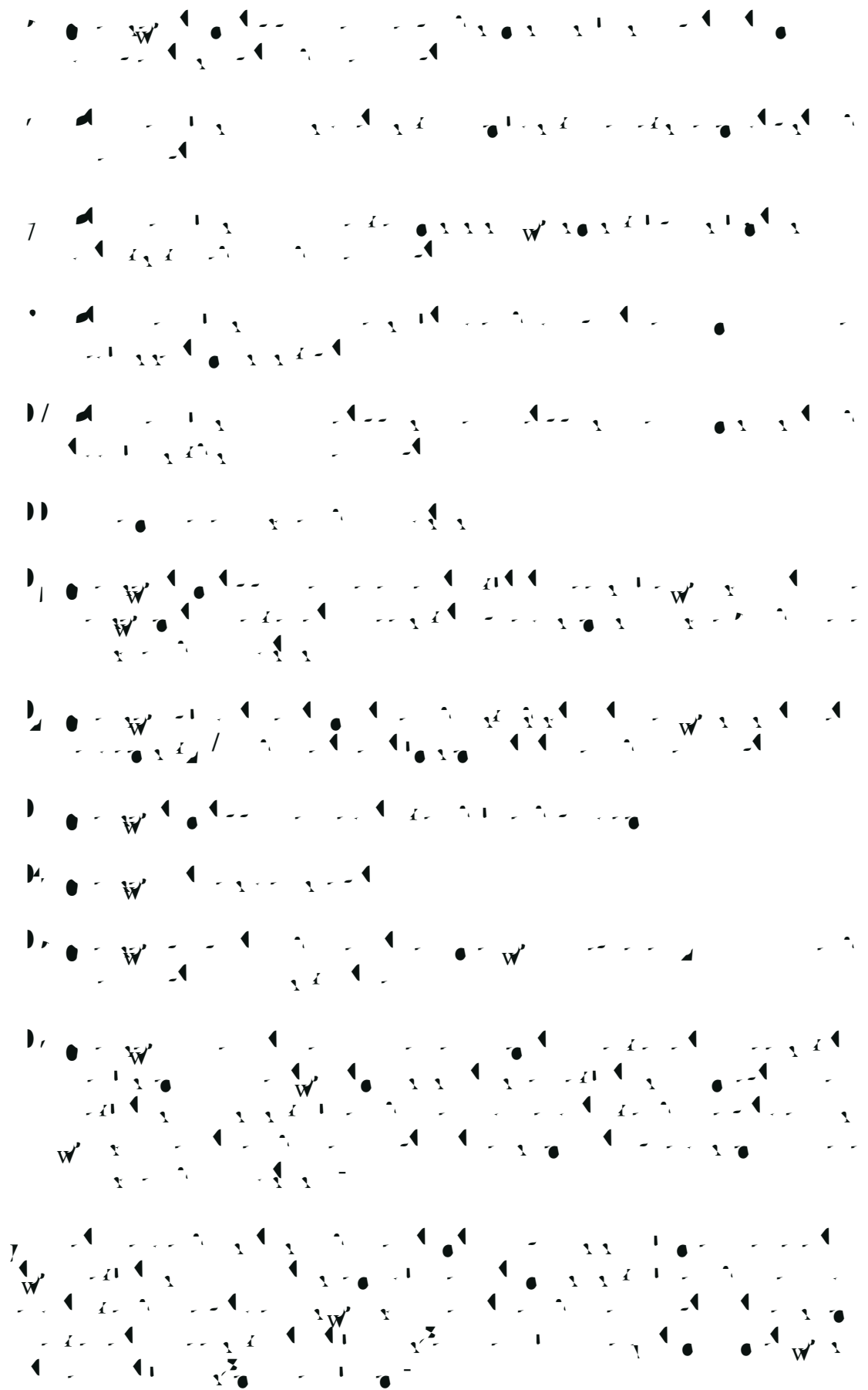

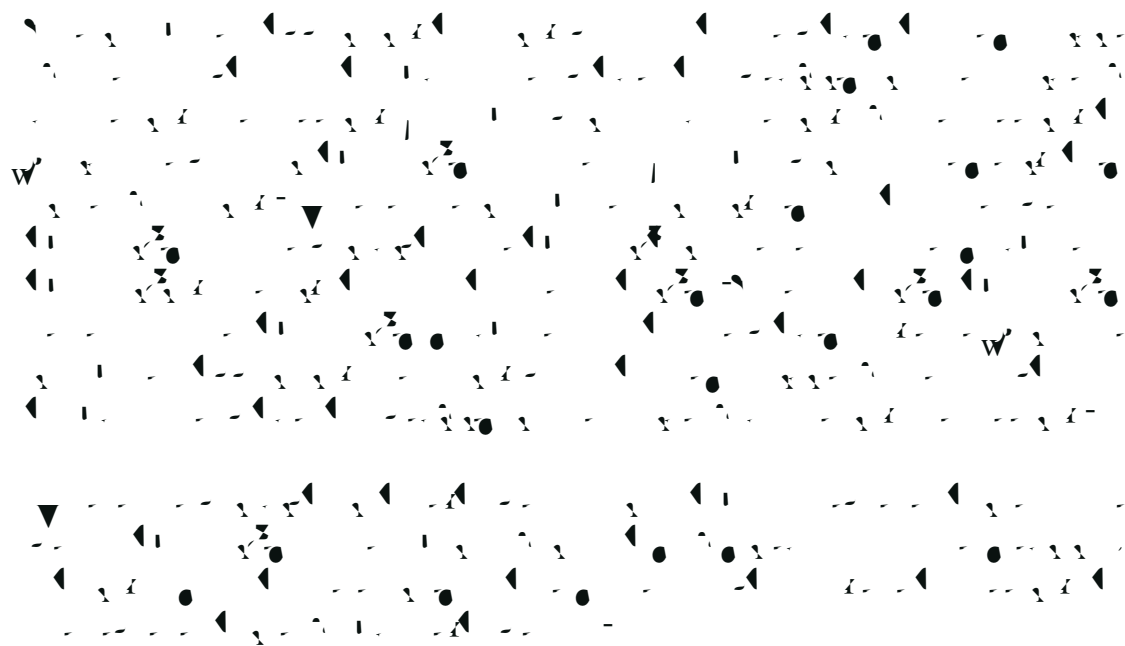

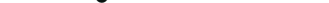

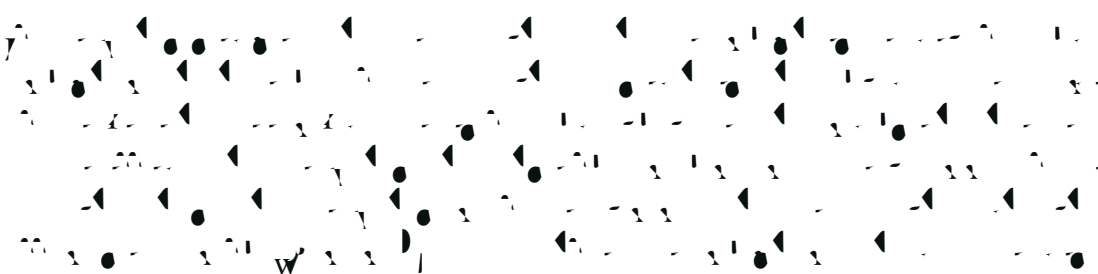

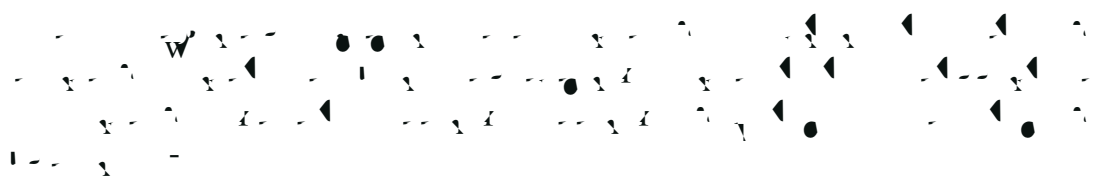
